

Image Group Print Preview

You may print image groups for "flash card" type study purposes. Instructor commentary will be printed as well. To do this open the Image Group that you want to print and then select the "Image group print preview" option from the "View" toolbar menu. You can choose to print all of the data associated with the images, in which case, select the "Print all image data" option. In order to view brief data information - which will include the Creator, Title, along with any Instructors' comments - choose the "Print Title/Creator/Commentary" option.

This will launch a print-ready browser window that contains a header with the title of your Image Group, followed by thumbnails of the images accompanied by their full (or brief) data records. Click the Print icon at the top of the window (or select the "Print" option from the "File" toolbar menu) to print out your Image Group.

	Title Commentary	Rome: model of city Circus Maximus: From the model of ancient Rome, shows huge chariot racing arena with Palatine with Emperor's "palace" complex. Circus Maximus could hold over 150,000 people.
	Title Commentary	Rome: Aqua Claudia & Anio Novus Roman aqueduct: Water was brought to Rome by a total of 13 aqueducts, thus allowing the growth of the population. Built with a gradual slope to allow gravity rather than pumps to bring water. Only when could not be built underground.
	Title Commentary	Togatus Barberini statue of a patrician bearing two ancestral portrait busts Roman patrician carrying busts of his ancestors: Roman portrait sculpture was originally highly realistic, attempting to idealize the subject. Noble Romans kept busts of their famous ancestors in special niches in their homes.
